<u>Themes From the Minor Prophets</u> Lesson 3 – Messianic Prophecies

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Introduction: In the midst of current issues, God gave future promises of a coming Messiah through the prophets.

- A. We can know when a passage is fulfilled when the N. T. tells us! (Acts 2:16-17)
 - 1. There are many teachers today while trying to interpret the New Testament in light of the Old Testament, even to the point of contradicting the New.
 - 2. It is important to harmonize and learn from the Old Testament.

(Mt 5:17-18; Rom 15:4)

- 3. Remember the limitations of the Old Testament prophets without the light of the New Testament Apostles and Prophets. (1 Pt 1:9-12)
- B. Some of the prophecies were well known and others were not.
 - 1. What prophecies were known in advance by the Jewish leaders?
 - 2. Remember, even with the prophecies, the coming of Christ was a mystery that was revealed at the right time! (Eph 1:9; 3:3, 9)

I. Prophecies of the Birth of the Messiah

- A. The Jewish leaders knew this prophecy! (Mt 2:1-8; Micah 5:2-5)
 - 1. This gives us an understanding of why prophecies both reveal and conceal!
 - 2. Satan is wiser than any man, but he could not determine God's plan from the Old Testament prophecies alone. (1 Cor 2:7-8)
- B. Some would have used this prophecy to conclude that Jesus was not the Messiah! (Jn 1:45-46; 7:40-43)
 - 1. I can understand why there would be difficulty in applying these verses.
 - 2. Did Jesus correct the mistaken applications of these people? Why?
- C. Jesus departure to and return from Egypt as a child was prophesied.

(Mt 2:14-15; Hosea 11:1)

- 1. How obvious was this passage a prophecy of the Messiah?
- 2. Sometime passages have a dual meaning.

II. Prophecies of John the Baptist and the Messiah

- A. Malachi, the last book of the Old Testament makes prophecy of both a messenger to go ahead of the Messiah and the Messiah Himself coming to the temple. (Mal 3:1-4)
 - 1. Mark tells us the fulfillment of this passage. (Mk 1:2-4)
 - 2. Jesus tells us the fulfillment of this passage. (Mt 11:7-10; Lk 7:24-27)
 - 3. What is the work of one who prepares the way? (Jn 3:30)
- B. Malachi speaks of one who will come in "the spirit and power of Elijah." (Mal 4:5-6)
 - 1. The Angel Gabriel tell Zacharias the fulfillment of this prophecy. (Lk 1:12-17)
 - 2. Jesus tells us that John the Baptist fulfilled this prophecy.

(Mt 11:11-15; 17:11-13; Mk 9:11-13)

- C. Did John the Baptist understand the fulfillment of this prophecy?
 - 1. Since his parents knew and John was a prophet, then he would certainly know.
 - 2. Why then did John answer "I am not" to the question "Are you Elijah?" (Jn 1:19-21)

3. Does the Bible contradict itself in this? What is the explanation?

III. Prophecies of Events in the Life of Christ

- A. What an unusual scenario, the Messiah coming on a "foal of a Donkey." (Zech 9:9)
 - 1. Mark, Luke and John mention only the colt that Jesus sat on.

(Mk 11:1-10; Lk 19:28-28; Jn 12:12-16)

- 2. Mathew gives more detail as he mentions both the mother and the colt were brought. (Mt 21:1-9)
- 3. Why are these accounts not a contradiction? Why would both animals be necessary?
- 4. The "lowly" Messiah is shown in this event. (Zech 9:9; Mt 11:29)
- B. The price of Judas' betrayal was prophesied. (Mt 27:1-10; Zech 11:12-13)
 - 1. The explanation of Jeremiah being mentioned could be explained in two possible ways.
 - a. Not everything Jeremiah said was written. (Jn 21:25)
 - b. Jeremiah is mention as representative of the prophets.
 - 2. The significance of this prophecy is that the betrayal of Jesus was foretold!
- C. The piercing of Jesus by the soldiers after His death was foretold.

(Zech 12:10; Jn 19:30-37; Rev 1:7)

- 1. This is strong eyewitness evidence of the death of Christ!
- 2. This is strong evidence of the resurrection of the righteous and the wicked at the 2nd coming of Jesus. (Jn 5:28-29; Acts 24:15)
- D. The scattering and stumbling of the Apostles at the arrest of Jesus is foretold.

(Zech 13:7; Mt 26:31, 55-56; Mk 14:27, 48-50)

- 1. The stumbling and denial by the Apostles was not unanticipated.
- 2. The power of the great Shepherd is also emphasized.

IV. Prophecies of the Reign of the Messiah

- A. The outpouring of the Holy Spirit beginning at the day of Pentecost was foretold. (Joel 2:28-32; Acts 2:14-21)
- B. The entrance of the Gentiles into the kingdom of God was foretold. (Amos 9:11-12; Acts 15:13-18)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. How can we know for sure when an O.T. prophecy is fulfilled?
- 2. What are the limitations of using the O.T without the guidance of the N.T. in understanding fulfilled prophecy?
- 3. Why were two donkeys used in the triumphal entrance of Jesus?
- 4. Was John the Baptist the fulfillment of Malachi's prophecy of the coming of Elijah? Explain.
- 5. Was Jesus betrayal by Judas prophesied? Why does this help us in our faith?
- 6. How did Amos's prophecy of the Gentiles help in the debate over circumcision and the place of the Old Law in the Jerusalem debate?
