Building a Godly Man Lesson 2 – Fathers, Mothers and Sons

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Introduction: Parents must be watchful and develop discernment in this generation.

- A. God's word is a bulwark in every generation. (Ps 119:97-105)
 - 1. Our challenge is to <u>discern and apply God's truths</u> to the present deceptions. I am amazed at how blind parents can be! (Heb 5:14)
 - 2. Technology including the internet and the smartphone has brought new challenges that we have not experienced before.
 - 3. Past walls that have kept influences away from the home <u>have been breached</u>.
- B. Even we are caught off guard and stumble we can pray for wisdom to get back up and stand. We *cannot be indifferent* and depend on others! (Ps 119:67-68)
 - 1. We will consider the discernments and the decisions parents need to make specifically to *raising a son*. Please be willing to ask for help!
 - 2. This takes *two dedicated Christians* who are willing to learn and to stand!

I. We want our sons to become leaders in serving others

- A. Men are *slower* to develop and learn about relationships.
 - 1. The natural strengths of boys push then towards *achievement and competition*.
 - 2. Learning how to <u>understand others and develop relationships</u> is something that they must develop later. Here is where wise parenting needs to focus.

(Mk 10:42-45; Prov 5:1-5, 20-23)

- B. Boys can easily be caught up in what I call a "digital dungeon." (2 Pt 2:19)
 - 1. Relationships <u>are complex and often disappointing</u>. Computer games are predictable, stimulating and emotionally rewarding. Porn is a major issue. (Eph 4:17-19)
 - 2. Parents must be watchful and wise to lead their child <u>to face and learn the more difficult lessons of life</u>. (Deut 4:9-10)
 - 3. Instant gratification in an imaginary digital world *ill prepares our sons for the real world*. Ordinary conversation is impacted by the digital world.
 - 4. Your sons future will be determined by his ability to discern <u>in forming and</u> keeping the right kind of relationships. (Prov 13:20-21)
- C. Parents <u>must be committed</u> to being personally involved with every aspect of their sons' life.
 - 1. This involves a full commitment of the heart and mind. (Deut 6:4-9)
 - 2. When you take on the raising of children you are taking on <u>a very hard task</u>. God will help the humble, dedicated child of God.
 - 3. Both before and after marriage there needs to be wise decisions about money. Mom needs to be able to *comfortably do the full-time job* of being a mother! (Titus 2:4-5; Prov 31:10-15)
 - 4. If the parents can set a good example of the skills of managing relationships then children can more easily learn these skills! *Have a good marriage*! (1 Pt 3:7)

II. What are we feeding our sons?

- A. Our children naturally want to respect and follow us. What are <u>they seeing and hearing</u>? They know when you really mean it! (Josh 4:5-6)
 - 1. Godly parents are always looking for opportunities to teach!
 - 2. What are they seeing in movies, music, video games *in our homes*? What about *the homes of others*?
 - 3. It is crucial to have your children trust you and want to talk to you!
- B. We can guide our children *in their friendships*. (Prov 13:19-20; Ps 119:74)
 - 1. It is best to be close to Christians with children that yours can be with!
 - 2. It is important to be around the friends of your children!
 - 3. We can be caught off-guard even when we do our best. Be alert and <u>do not be</u> overconfident! (Ex. Boy raised by his "uncle" and then discovered "uncles.")
 - 4. We also can guide children in their role models!
- C. We must know what is being taught in the classroom.
 - 1. What was once a place where we could comfortably place our children has now become *a potential serious danger*. What if we are not aware? (2 Pt 2:1-2)
 - 2. We often found our children *had been exposed to indoctrination* concerning the homosexual agenda. Fortunately, we often talked about it.
 - 3. Schools can now *hide crucial information from parents*. They can guide and distribute materials that promote open immorality.
 - 4. There is a real agenda *pushed by the federal government* that we need to be aware of.
- D. Boys need to be *developed to be a male* that is to learn to be a man.

(1 Chron 22:11-13)

- 1. One of the *greatest evils I have seen* is the gender-choice deception.
- 2. If a boy does not feel like he belongs with boys this is a major issue. Boys <u>need</u> to achieve success and have a strong purpose of being a man.
- 3. It is important that boys learn how to *work with and to achieve goals* with other boys. Sports can play a significant role here.
- 4. Unlike girls, boys first are attached to their mothers but then <u>must make a transition later to be very close to their fathers</u>.

III. Some suggestions to strengthen our homes

- A. Make justice and mercy a major element *in all of your relationships*. (Hos 12:6)
 - 1. We should often teach our children about *this aspect of God's nature*! (Hos 2:19-20)
 - 2. Our tongues will reflect the grace that is in our hearts. (James 4:6, 8-10)
 - 3. What if our tongues are filled with anger, grudges and unfair judgements of others? We can *make our children a "child of hell."* (Mt 23:23; 15)
- B. Make attending all church services a real commitment. (Heb 10:23-25; Mt 6:33)
 - 1. When real worship is taught and praised then your children can also learn!
 - 2. When other things come first then another lesson is taught. *Great lessons* can be taught in sports teams when church services come first!
