## Building a Godly Man Lesson 4 – How Wives Can Build up Their Husbands <u>www.aubeacon.com</u>

Introduction: God's wisdom does not come from within but from God Himself.

A. A common mistake we make is to *rely own our own wisdom or "instincts.*"

- 1. How many times have we been *committed to a "pattern of failure"* because of stubbornness or pride? (Jer 10:23-24; Prov 16:1-2; Ps 37:23-25)
- 2. The wisdom of God is powerful and understandable! Why do *more not find and heed it*? Do we really trust God?
- 3. The advice of the world is <u>why there are major issues in men today</u>! (Jn 14:27)
- B. God's wisdom has shown us the differences between men and women.
  - 1. The "unisex" movement and its advice is toxic and *is certain to destroy men*.
  - 2. God has shown us that the basic needs of men and women are different! (Eph 5:33)
  - 3. Our "instincts" even done is goodwill will cause us <u>to give our mates what we</u> <u>need</u>! That is done as a result of <u>a lack of wisdom</u>.

## I. Wives must diligently learn what respect means.

A. God instructs wives to unconditionally respect their husbands!

(Eph 5:33; 1 Pt 3:1-2 NASV)

- 1. This is similar to *the unconditional love of God*. (Rom 5:8)
- 2. It is easy to acknowledge this truth about respect *but what does respect mean*?
- 3. There are no circumstances where a wife should have no respect for her mate!
- B. What <u>does it mean</u> for a wife to respect her husband?

**<u>Respect</u>** - (a) absolutely be frightened, be alarmed, be afraid (MT 10.31... (2) reverence, have respect for, fear; (a) toward God (LU 1.50); (b) toward a person (EP 5.33) – <u>**Friberg Lexicon**</u>

**3.** to reverence, venerate, to treat with deference or reverential obedience: Mark 6:20; Eph. 5:33; used of his devout worshippers, Luke 1:50; 18:2, 4; Acts 10:2, 22, 35... - <u>Thayer's Lexicon</u>

- 1. Respect is *not dishonesty or flattery*. One should never esteem that which is condemned by God. (Psa 12:2-3; Prov 26:28; Jude 16)
- 2. We can draw similar lessons from *our attitudes and actions towards our rulers*! (Acts 23:2-5; 2 Pt 2:10-11; 1 Tim 2:1-2)
- 3. We should show *respect for rulers and the place that they have* because of God's will. (Ex. How should a child act towards a difficult police officer?)
- 4. Respect first comes from a reverence towards God that then <u>shows proper</u> <u>honor and obedience</u> towards those God has placed in authority.
- 5. It is hard for a wife to <u>understand her husband's need for respect</u> or to know the <u>components of how to show respect</u>. She needs teaching! (Prov 19:14)
- 6. It is assumed in scripture that each mate *has goodwill towards the other*! This should be acknowledged and built upon. (1 Cor 7:33-34)

## II. Consider the basic components of showing respect to the husband

(These six points are from the book "Love and Respect" by Emerson Eggeriches)

A. Appreciate his desire *to work and to achieve*.

- 1. God has designed man to lead! Consider the creation of man and woman.
- 2. God gave man work in paradise! (Gen 2:15, 19-20)

- 3. Woman was <u>to be a "helper"</u> in Adam's quest to work. In the Hebrew it means: "a help answering to him" or "one who answers." (Gen 2:18; 1 Cor 11:9)
- 4. A man finds *significant fulfillment in work*. By design God has placed within man a desire to accomplish and achieve.
- 5. Listen and encourage the husband in his work. Often express thanks.
- 6. Support him and ask for his guidance. Do not *look down on honorable work*.
- B. Appreciate his desire to protect and to provide.
  - 1. A man seeks to protect his family by *providing physical things and by shielding the family from harm*. The man is at heart a warrior. (1 Tim 6:12; 2 Tim 4:7)
  - 2. When the family suffers from need the husband *is greatly burdened*. (Eph 4:28)
  - 3. The husband gladly will *put himself in danger to protect his family*.
  - 4. How <u>a man thinks and reacts</u> often will puzzle the wife. A strong and seemingly harsh stand may be the right thing to do under certain circumstances.
  - 5. A man may lack wisdom and fight the wrong battles however sincere!
  - 6. When a man forsakes this <u>he does not respect himself</u>! (Heb 12:7; 1 Tim 5:8)
- C. Appreciate his desire *to serve and to lead*.
  - 1. God has placed the husband in a position of leadership. (Eph 5:22-24)

<u>Submit</u> - (1) active subject, bring under firm control, subordinate (RO 8.20b); (2) ... (a) .. compulsion have to submit (LU 10.17, 20); (b) ... voluntary submission be submissive, obey, subject oneself (LU 2.51; EP 5.21)

- 2. The wife will build up her husband by submission! (1 Pt 3:1, 4)
- 3. As a godly husband I am humbled by *the great risk my wife took in placing herself under me*. I will want to listen to her and put her first!
- 4. What risk does a Christian woman take marrying a non-Christian? Paul would never even consider marrying anyone but a Christian! (1 Cor 9:5)
- 5. Show respect *by complement and encouragement*. A man can stand the turmoil of the world if he is respected at home. (Ex. Salesman waiting to see husband.)
- D. Appreciate his desire *to analyze and to council*.
  - 1. Consider *the responsibility and wisdom* that is needed to lead. (Eph 5:23-29)
  - 2. The husband must know *where to take the family and how to get there*! A wise husband will also know when he does not know and where to get advice!
  - 3. A man finds respect in *knowing how to "fix things*." He naturally will want to express his thoughts and show how to do it right!

"recognize his problem-solving approach as his male brand of empathy!" – from Love and Respect

4. How does a wise wife *disagree while showing respect*?

## (Prov21:9; 25:24; 1 Sam 25:28-32)

- E. Appreciate his desire *for sexual intimacy*.
  - 1. Here is where men and women differ greatly! (1 Cor 7:3-5)
  - 2. If a man fails to have his wife feel that she is loved then this becomes very difficult for her. A wise man *needs to understand his wife*! (1 Pt 3:7)
  - 3. A woman may herself place a lower priority on this and then conclude that the husband does as well. *That is a great mistake*!
  - 4. Please do not let your marriage become <u>"a house-keeping relationship!"</u>
