Building a Godly Man Lesson 5 – How the Local church can Build Godly Men <u>www.aubeacon.com</u>

Introduction: Men are built by the Lord on a foundation of repentance.

- A. The power of the gospel can take *anyone from any background* and powerfully build them up to as a new creation! (Rom 1:16-17; Acts 20:32)
 - 1. The complete turning of the will along with the perfect provisions of God will always produce *change beyond what one would think possible*.
 - 2. Consider the change in the man once possessed by demons. (Lk 8:39)
- B. The challenge of a local church is that we <u>keep preaching that same gospel of</u> <u>repentance</u>! (Mt 3:1-2; 4:17)
 - 1. The natural strength that God has given men *must be subdued and directed*.
 - 2. Why has the participation of men in local churches dropped? Many have <u>become cowardly</u> and substituted <u>the soothing voice of human reason</u>.
 - 3. The agenda of this age that promotes relationship over repentance <u>drives men</u> <u>away</u> from a religion that costs them nothing. (1 Chron 21:24-26)

I. Men need to plainly hear the challenging demands of the gospel

- A. The plain exposing of deceit combined with the challenge *to change and fight with a purpose* appeals to the real needs of men! (Mt 3:7-10; Acts 24:16, 24-25)
 - 1. The gospel demands *the whole heart*.
 - 2. The Christian life is *a fight with a real purpose*. (2 Tim 2:3-7)
 - 3. Men readily *identify with and respond to* these exhortations.
- B. When churches become ashamed of these powerful demands, *they become weak*, *inconsistent and hypocritical*.
 - 1. This makes both the Lord and men of conviction *sick*. (Rev 3:16-19)
 - 2. Men when taught and trained men can <u>keep a church on the difficult path</u> God has placed before them. (Acts 20:27-31)
 - 3. When God's plan becomes an afterthought then a cheap and false gospel is preached and accepted. Men *despise cowardly wimps*! (Mk 8:38)
- C. Like a powerful horse, men must daily be challenged *to yield their spirits to God*.
 - 1. The control of the tongue is *about controlling the heart*. (James 3:3-5)
 - 2. It takes *wise, personal and powerful teaching* to keep reaching hearts.
 - 3. How do we build the fruit of the Spirit and fight the works of the flesh? Plain and detailed teaching is needed along with *personal challenge and rebuke*.
 - 4. Some of our more "tender" souls may not understand why things are stated like they are. *Proper leadership is needed* here. (2 Tim 4:2-4)

II. Men need to see and associate with men of true conviction

- A. All men need "heroes." Consider *the men God places* as a "cloud of witnesses" before us! (Heb 12:1; 11:32-35)
 - 1. *Every generation* has its challenges and an ungodly culture to overcome.

- 2. Where do we find our personal heroes? It begins with <u>men and women that have</u> <u>taken a personal interest in us</u> and have built us up. (1 Tim 1:5-7)
- 3. <u>*Who*</u> did Timothy look up to? (2 Tim 3:10, 14-15)
- 4. Did others *look up to Timothy*? (Phil 2:19-22)
- B. Through both teaching and examples men need to *build their abilities to discern*. (Heb 5:12-14; Acts 20:31)
 - 1. Specific, detailed preaching is very needed. What good is it if we cannot *apply it to our lives*?
 - 2. Men need *to see conflict and leadership in action*. The example of seeing a man of faith in action can teach much!
- C. Godly men need *to disciple other men*. (2 Tim 2:2)
 - 1. How did Jesus train the Apostles?
 - 2. How can <u>we begin this process</u> of discipleship? Should we pursue it or must it be assigned?
 - 3. We can *point men* to other Godly men! (Jn 1:36-37)

III. Men need to see leaders lead the local church

A. Local churches can powerfully build up others when *it is properly led*.

(Eph 4:11-12, 14-15)

- 1. Shepherds *can build* an "atmosphere of trust and of open hearts."
- 2. This takes *planting, watering and weeding*. It involves both a building up and a tearing down. (Titus 1:10-11; 1 Pt 5:2-4)
- 3. Leadership will duplicate itself in what is both good and bad!
- B. When members refuse to work out problems as God's word directs, then *they must be confronted*. (Mt 18:15-17; Titus 3:10-11)
 - 1. Repentance must be demanded and there *must be a purging of that leaven*!
 - 2. When the bitter, contentious man *departs a local church* the "atmosphere" is changed. We must be able to trust each other!
- C. Our men need to be properly recognized and praised.
 - 1. Consider some of the men Paul personally recognized!
 - a. Philemon (Philemon 4-7)
 - b. Onesiphorus (2 Tim 1:16-18)
 - c. Many more could be added!
 - 2. Paul was willing to encourage and praise those who in the past had disappointed him. Consider John Mark! (Acts 12:25; 15:37-39; 2 Tim 4:11)
- D. When you build on a foundation of repentance then *true change always restores relationship and trust*. We major in forgiveness! (Eph 4:31-32)
 - 1. It is the grace and forgiveness of God that gives us our strength!
 - 2. We need the discernment and wisdom *to see and expose sin* in one another.
 - 3. We also need the humility and love to <u>help one another in our weaknesses</u>! (Prov 10:12; 17:9; 1 Pt 4:8-9)
