"My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me?" (A Study of Psalm 22) www.aubeacon.com

Introduction: Have you ever wonder what was going through the mind of Christ during His crucifixion?

- A. We have this insight from Psalms 22!
 - 1. This is a perfect example of how to focus the mind while suffering. (Heb 5:7-8)
 - 2. We see the battle between what Jesus saw and the unseen, what Jesus knew from God's word .
 - 3. Jesus used this very approach when tempted by Satan earlier in life. (Mt 4:8-11)
- B. How does God answer prayer in suffering?
 - 1. With Jesus there was a far greater gift than just the relief from pain! (Heb 5:9)
 - 2. If we could so prepare our minds to be like Christ in suffering we will be blessed beyond measure!
 - 3. This is an excellent chapter to meditate upon for the Lord's Supper.
- C. This passage was written 1,100 years before the death of Christ!

I. The mind of Christ at the Cross

- A. Jesus saw that He was forsaken. (22:1-2)
 - 1. Jesus was crying out to God in His pain. (Mt 27:46)
 - 2. He cried out both in light and darkness. (Mt 27:45)
 - 3. Jesus was the perfect sacrifice for the sins of the world. (2 Cor 5:21)
- B. But Jesus knew that God is always true! (22:3-5)
 - 1. Because Jesus had so prepared His heart, He could see beyond the physical realm. How could He do this? He knew God's promises. (1 Pt 2:21-23)
 - 2. God is "enthroned in the praises of Israel." Why? He is holy!
 - 3. God will always deliver those who trust in Him. There are no exceptions! (Ps 34:3-5)
 - 4. Do you know this as a certainty?
- C. Jesus saw that He was despised. (22:6-8)
 - 1. After being beaten and nailed to the cross His appearance was that of a worm.
 - 2. His enemies surrounded Him and shouted insults. (Mt 27:41-44)
 - 3. Evil men will try to beat the righteous down with their deeds and their tongues.
- D. Jesus knew that God had always loved Him. (22:9-11)
 - 1. God provided for Him from conception! He does so to us as well.
 - 2. Because of this He called out for God's help and was comforted that He will answer! He will always help when there is "none to help."
- E. Jesus saw that His body was wounded and dying. (22:12-18)
 - 1. Jesus described in detail the physical effects of a death upon the cross.
- " How painful was crucifixion? One man describes it like this:

The unnatural position made every movement painful; the lacerated veins and crushed tendons throbbed with incessant anguish; the wounds, inflamed by exposure, gradually gangrened; the arteries-especially at the head and stomach -- became swollen and oppressed with surcharged blood; and while each variety of misery went on gradually

increasing, there was added to them the intolerable pang of a burning and raging thirst; and all these physical complications caused an internal excitement and anxiety, which made the prospect of death itself -- of death, the unknown enemy, at whose approach man usually shudders most -- bear the aspect of a delicious and exquisite release."

- 2. During His death he heard hatred and scorn from those surrounding Him. The soldiers even gambled for His clothing. (Mt 27:35-36)
- F. Jesus knew that God would deliver Him. (22:19-21)
 - 1. In spite of everything He could see, He knew that God would respond!
 - 2. Abraham had this kind of faith. (Rom 4:17-18; Heb 11:18-19)
 - 3. Will you prepare you mind so you too will believe these things in suffering?

II. God's answer to Jesus' prayer

- A. "You have answered Me." (22:21)
 - 1. This simple statement overshadows and erases all the pain that went before!
 - 2. If we could only see the answer God has for us. (2 Cor 4:17-18)
- B. The answer of God produced overwhelming praise. (22:22-25)
 - 1. God did what He said, Jesus was heard by the Father and He was delivered.
 - 2. This joy not only caused God to be praised but Jesus wanted all men to join Him in this praise.
 - 3. Did you sing today? What was in your hearts? (Heb 2:11-12; 13:15)
 - 4. This joy will overflow into obedience in all things. (Heb 13:16)
- C. The answer of God to Jesus provides an answer for all of us. (22:26-31)
 - 1. Why did Jesus go to the cross? (Rom 5:6-8)
 - 2. Are you seeking God? There is good news!
 - 3. Here we plainly see the fulfillment of God's promise to Abraham. (Gen 12:1-3)
- D. Jesus wants us to proclaim God's answer to all men, from generation to generation.
 - 1. Peter did exactly what Jesus said. (Acts 2:38-39)
 - 2. What message do you have to tell?

III. Why we now glory in the cross

- A. Because it has allowed me to die to the world. (Gal 2:20)
 - 1. What a relief to let go of the things which do not matter! (1 Tim 6:10)
 - 2. When you see the cross you should in turn despise the world. (Gal 6:14)
- B. Because it makes me know the certainty of God's promises.
 - 1. If God raised Jesus, He will also raise me up! (2 Cor 4:13-14)
 - 2. As a consequence, I will not submit to those who would change the gospel. (Gal 5:11, 6:12)
- C. Because I understand the value of salvation.
 - 1. What price was paid for my sin? Do you see the value?
 - 2. When men see the value they will tell others. (Acts 8:3-4)

Conclusion: Why are you here today?

- A. If you are seeking a better way there is good news! (22:26; Acts 8:38-39)
- B. If you are here to rejoice in God's answer, then you will be satisfied. (Heb 2:12)
- C. What other reasons might some be here? Will you open your heart?
