### God's Restoration Movement

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*Introduction:* There is only one kind of restoration that pleases God.

- A. God restores the heart of people. (Psa 23:1-3)
  - 1. Anything less than this is to "play religion and to play church." (Joel 2:12-13)
  - 2. What does God see in your heart?
- B. As a fruit of restored hearts we find obedience to God in all things.
  - 1. What should the local church be like? A restored heart will want to know and make corrections.
  - 2. Is it unspiritual to talk about the "one true church" or point out the differences between denominational practices and what our head wants? NO!
  - 3. Where is our emphasis when we say these things, the head or us? (Col 2:18-19)
- C. Are you in need of a restored heart?
  - 1. Just as we see in spring a renewal and revival of life, we too can have our hearts drift from fervent service to Him. (Hos 14:7)
  - 2. How does one come out of the spiritual doldrums and have this needed revival?

## I. We must have our sight renewed.

- A. Jesus often spoke of closed hearts as blindness.
  - 1. Will the real blind man please stand up? (Jn 9:32-41)
  - 2. We need to see how easy it is for our hearts to deceive us. (Jer 17:9-10)
  - 3. Can I have great Bible knowledge and be blind? YES

"Revival and the exclusive love of comfortable truths are bitter enemies."

- B. We must want to see our hearts.
  - 1. The opening of a heart is a dangerous process for both the speaker and the hearer. It is painful. (Acts 2:37; 7:54)

"Revival is ... God revealing himself to man in awful holiness and irresistible power.... If we find a revival that is not spoken against, we had better look again to ensure that it is a revival." - Arthur Wallis

- 2. Only the humble will ultimately see and profit from this. (**Isa 57:15**)
- 3. This is how suffering helps us. (Ex. "Discontentment in life always has a spiritual root. Look to your spiritual foundations first.")
- 4. The humble man will welcome an open Bible. He will listen.
- C. What is the greatest danger for the church here?
  - 1. That we let our prosperity and education put us to sleep. (Rev 3:14-19)
  - 2. History has show that the larger, prosperous churches in the cities are the leaders in every apostasy. Why is this?
  - 3. If we are going to be the exception we are going to have to be exceptional!

### II. We must see God anew.

- A. If we were truly converted to Christ we were moved by God's glory.
  - 1. Satan's game plan is to keep you from seeing God. (2 Cor 4:3-4)
  - 2. Many are converted to local churches and the men in them. (2 Cor 4:5-6)
  - 3. We serve an awesome God. Do you see Him? If so your heart will be moved.
- B. Consider from Psalms 119 the things about God that revives us.

- 1. We see His word and not worthless things. (Psa 119:25, 37)
- 2. We see His lovingkindness. (**Psa 119:88, 156; Psa 36:7**)
- 3. We see His justice. (**Psa 119:149**)
- 4. We trust in His judgements. (Psa 119:156; 1 Sam 3:17-18)
- B. Worship can keep our hearts renewed.
  - 1. The right kind of worship will open hearts. (**Psa 73:14-17**)
  - 2. Why do we give such emphasis to the Lord's Supper? (2 Pt 1:9; Gal 3:1)
  - 3. If you do not see yourself before God today then you need to learn how to worship.
    - a. Are you focused on the presence of others or of God?
    - b. Do you approach this time in a casual way both in your heart and by your dress?
    - c. One of the great challenges by our young who are raised by Christians is to learn the reverence of this occasion and make the "common" "uncommon."

# III. We need conviction of sin and of righteousness.

- A. God's word is powerful when it is unleashed. (Jn 16:8-11)
  - 1. Do you really want this? Jesus will overturn many tables in the hearts of men. Many will be mad.
  - 2. Who did God call on to restore His people so they might receive Jesus? (Mk 9:11-13)
  - 3. Could John the Baptist preach here? (Mt 3:2,7-10)
    - a. Could the Pharisees have called John a brotherhood watchdog?
    - b. How we respond to current controversies will show much about us.
- B. Conviction does not come from a casual approach to God.
  - 1. Does our worship challenge the hearts of all here? (1 Cor 14:24-25)
  - 2. What kind of preaching do you want? Elders have a great responsibility in this area. (Acts 20:27-28)
  - 3. Are we looking for something new for the sake of newness?

### IV. We then will look to renew others.

- A. Are you involved with others? If so does your life have an influence? (Mt 5:13-16)
  - 1. What things cause our lives to be an influence?
  - 2. Can the half-hearted Christian influence anyone? Unfortunately yes.
  - 3. Parents, what would your Children say is most important to you?
- B. If you are renewed you will be zealous. (**Rev 3:18-19**)
  - 1. Do you know of any zealous Christians here? Do you know of any who are not zealous? Where do you fit?
  - 2. Which is better, zeal without knowledge of knowledge without zeal? (Rom 10:1-2)
  - 3. Why are home studies effective? It is because of what we hear and what we see. Word and example
- C. Are you a zealous person? If no, then when are you going to repent? (**Tit 2:14**) *Conclusion:* Are you a part of God's restoration movement? (**Acts 3:19-21**)
