The Home as God Would Have it (3) The Power of the Marriage Relationship

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Introduction: The power of God can overcome anything the world throws at it.

A. Satan has been successful in destroying things that are good.

(Lk 22:31-32; Mk 4:15; 1 Pt 5:8-9)

- 1. A man would be a fool to face Satan alone, yet many do.
- 2. How many ways can Satan defeat us? Peter was determined to beat Satan alone.
- B. When we choose to walk by faith, we receive the council and protection of God.
 - 1. Jesus defeated Satan and now He wants to help us! (Jn 14:30; Heb 2:14-16, 18)
 - 2. We need to understand that God's ways will be laughed at by the world.
 - 3. We can with confidence defeat this world. (1 Jn 5:4-5)

I. The marriage relationship is given by God to strengthen us.

- A. Man is a social creature and by design he needs others. (Ecc 4:8-12)
 - 1. God allowed Adam to see and admit this need. What a great gift God gave Adam! (Gen 2:20-24)
 - 2. God's design will work beyond what we think is possible.
- B. God's design can easily be perverted and become a curse.
 - 1. The home can be a place that tears down others and promotes ungodliness. (Prov 3:33, 11:29; 21:9, 25:24)
 - 2. It does not have to be that way! (Prov 12:7, 14:1, 11)
- C. The home is a place to serve others. (Prov 31:10-12)
 - 1. This is why worldliness cannot work in the home! Marriage is for 3.
 - 2. When we raise children to be friends of the world then they will not be good mates. (1 Jn 4:5-6)
 - 3. What a great place the home is when filled with faith and service. It becomes a place for healing, learning and praise.

II. I must come to know myself to be a servant

- A. God can help me to see my heart and to see my needs. (Heb 4:12)
 - 1. When I know myself then I can see my tendencies and my weaknesses.
 - 2. If I cannot be honest about myself then I will have great difficulties with relationships.
 - 3. Peter did not see his weaknesses and tried to talk his way into "strength." He needed to heed Jesus' warning and His council. (Mt 26:34-35, 40-41)
 - 4. If Peter could only see the need that Jesus saw then he could have stood.
- B. Where are your weaknesses towards sin? (Gal 5:19-21)
 - 1. Those that are battling depression or a poor upbringing *must* come to understand their tendencies towards losing control of their thoughts and reality.
 - 2. When you can see your tendencies then you can prepare to respond to emotional times. You also can communicate to others about your needs.
 - 3. When you refuse to see the real issues in your life then you will lash out at others and have others seek to minimize their time around you.

III. I must come to know my mate in order to serve

- A. What are the needs of a man? (Eph 5:33)
 - 1. Consider this list from a class: a. Trust b. Acceptance c. Appreciation d. Admiration e. Approval f. Encouragement
 - 2. I heard a tape on this subject as a single man and learned a lot about myself.
 - 3. There are other male related and personality related characteristics that your must learn about yourself! (Ex. I used to beat myself up over personality.)
- B. What are the needs of a woman? (Eph 5:25, 1 Pt 3:7)
 - 1. Consider this list from a class: a. Caring b. Understanding c. Respect d. Devotion e. Validation f. Reassurance
 - 2. There are things that a woman will do that a man would never on his own figure out. If a man will listen, then he will be blessed.
 - 3. Consider how men and women deal with stress. When I as a man understand this, then I can with joy give my wife what see needs.

IV. I must constantly renew my commitment to be a servant

- A. It is in the heart of a servant that the power of God is found. (Phil 2:1-4)
 - 1. We seek to be near a servant that has the love of God.
 - 2. To be a servant I must get out of myself. That is a challenge that can only be met by crucifixion. (Lk 9:26-27)
- B. Do you look out to your mates needs first? (1 Cor 7:3-5)
 - 1. I am so glad to be needed and to be able to serve.
 - 2. There is no greater joy than to look back on your life and see unselfish service. (Phil 2:17-18)
 - 3. I have found great personal strength in remembering the service of my own parents.
- C. What is keeping you from being a servant?
 - 1. Are you a Christian?
 - 2. Are you serving God and involved with His people? (Heb 10:23-25)
 - 3. Are you too busy with worldly things?
 - 4. Are you unable to get out of your own emotional turmoil?

V. God will powerfully bless us if we would let Him

- A. As time passes we will clearly see this. (Prov 31:10, 25)
 - 1. Why not take time to talk with those Christians who have had successful marriages. (Ex. Horace Huggins)
 - 2. What a blessing to see what we really need and to be able to turn away from those things we do not need.
- B. Our children and grandchildren will be blessed by God. (Prov 23:24-25)
 - 1. I want to give my children to God. I can! (Prov 22:6)
 - 2. How sad to see parents that fail to take advantage of a local church.
