Why I Left the World

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Introduction: There are some things common to all Christians.

- A. Everyone who is a Christian has once lived in the world. (Titus 3:3; Eph 2:2-3)
 - 1. It not an enjoyable thing to look back at a time of self-deceit and bondage.
 - 2. Paul found this a good teaching opportunity to describe his past struggles. (1 Tim 1:12-15)
 - 3. It is my prayer that this study will help us not only to hate worldliness but to rejoice in the grace of God that has freed us from the bondage of sin
- B. One must be born again to leave the world! (Jn 3:3-5; Rom 6:3-4)
 - 1. The new birth by necessity involves a radical change of thinking.
 - 2. Many are in churches but in reality are still in the world.
 - 3. Let us look back on that painful time when Christ was not in our lives.

I. What is the "Worldliness"?

- A. Worldliness is a philosophy of life. (1 Jn 2:15-17)
 - 1. **The lust of the flesh** We have God given desires and emotional needs. Do we control them or do they control us?
 - 2. **The lust of the eyes** We make judgments on the things we see. What is reality? What will really last?
 - 3. **The pride of life** It is easy to compare yourself to others and gain "esteem" from that. This desire is like a drug addiction that must be fed an increased.
- B. The root idea of worldliness lies in an unrestrained fulfillment of our lusts.
 - 1. How do you make decisions? The worldly person looks within and is essentially self centered. He makes judgments on what he can see and hold.
 - 2.. The Godly person looks to God. He seeks the council of the unseen as found in the scriptures.
 - 3. Worldliness is very subtle; most worldly people do not know it!
 - 4. One is worldly if his guide is self and not God.
 - a. He may focus on what **outwardly seems good**.
 - b. Family. (1 Cor 7:32-33)
 - c. Religion. (Col 2:8)

II. Worldliness thrives on deception

- A. Outwardly I though of myself as being in control.
 - 1. A worldly man **does not control himself**, his lust do! (Eph 2:1-3)
 - 2. This mind is from "the prince of the power of the air." Satan is the ruler of all worldly people! (John 12:31, 14:30; 16:11; 2 Cor 4:4)
 - 3. Worldly people find comfort in numbers. Because of this they think of themselves as "pretty good." What did Jesus say? (Mt 7:13-14; Lk 6:26)
 - 4. Inwardly I was fearful and allowed the pressure of what others thought to mold me. I was a slave! (**Rom 6:20-21**)
- B. I sought things that would not last and acted as if they would not end. (1 Cor 7:29-31)

- 1. In high school my happiness depended on meeting the standards of the world.
- 2. Things that were not wrong within themselves were seen as the road to success. Such as dating, career, having good looks and many other things.
- 3. This deceit was easy to accept as long as things did not change. My first challenge came when I graduated from high school and looked change in the face.
- C. I claimed to be a Christian but hated the "rules" of righteousness.

(Jn 15:18-19; 1 Jn 3:13)

- 1. If you stand as a Christian, the world will not like it!
- 2. At one time in my life I did not like Christians either (that is real Christians, not the name only kind).
- 3. Those who would dare be against drinking or the prom or other social norms would be considered "judgmental" (Even if they did not say a word!).
 (1 Pt 4:3-4)
- 4. The world screams out:" Do Not Correct Me!" The present day "non-traditional" movement in churches is full of this spirit. (John 16:20)
- D. I thought I was going to heaven! (John 16:2-3)
 - 1. I has the "Good old boy" concept. I had no concept of God's judgment.
 - 2. I did not understand the consequences of my own sin. (Rom 3:23; 6:23)
 - 3. I wanted a religion to salve my conscience but *not one that changed me*.
 - 4. My goals, heart and life was in the world. But I thought I was going to heaven.
- E. I had *<u>no peace</u>* in my life but I was afraid and did not know what to do.
 - 1. Yes I had my **highs**, but they were **temporary.**
 - 2. I was not in control! I had to constantly look for that "high".
 - 3. In fact I wanted escape. What a vain life! (John 14:27; 16:32-33)
- F. I had to wear a mask because of my self deception.
 - 1. With the world, you wear a mask. Dishonesty is a must. (Jn 14:17; 2 Cor 4:4)
 - 2. There is another way! (**Rom 7:24-25**)

III. How I was able to be freed from the slavery of the world

- A. I asked God for light. (Jn 7:17)
 - 1. I was moving too fast into sin.
 - 2. I faced death and my mask was removed in terror. I knew I was lost.
 - 3. I beagn to seek God from a reading of the Bible.
- B. We must die to the world.
 - 1. We must be *sick* of it! (James 4:3-4)
 - 2. We must *die* to our lusts. (Gal 6:14)
- C. We must live a life on **Conviction (1 John 5:4-5)**

Conclusion: What does the worldly life lead to? Let us wake up and live for God!

- A. Sadly many who leave the world later find a way back in. (2 Pet 2:20; 1 Jn 4:4-5).
- B. What a great salvation we have in the Lord! (1 Tim 1:15-17)
