How Love Solves Church Problems (1 Cor 13) www.cvillechurch.com

Introduction: How many churches have suffered through carnal fights?

- A. Without exception these battles come from men who want to pervert the gifts of God to draw attention to themselves. (1 Cor 4:6-7)
 - 1. God's plan is to draw our attention away from ourselves and make us like Him.
 - 2. The change of our hearts takes time. Satan will not give up, especially with Christians. (Jas 4:13-18)
- B. Where does God place the value? (1 Cor 12:31)
 - 1. The Corinthians were seeking the gift of tongues and placing a great value on it.
 - 2. Why did they place the value here? This was a mistake. They were not interested in the work of God but in self-advancement.

I. Things that have less value than love (13:1-3)

A. Eloquence

- 1. This has a value. What was the strength of Apollos? (Acts 18:24)
- 2. Paul lacked this, but was he useful to God? (2 Cor 10:10; 11:6)
- 3. How does God view eloquence without love? Where are you?

B. Wisdom

- 1. Wisdom has a value depending on its source. (1 Cor 1:18-22; 2:6-7, 13)
- 2. Is this wisdom enough? What does God say? (1 Cor 8:1)

C. Faith

1. We need to feed our faith and have it increase. (Heb 11:6; Eph 6:16)

2. What is faith without a foundation? (Eph 3:17)

D. Martyrdom

1.We need men and women who have the courage to stand! The testing and exposing of false teachers takes great courage. (**Rev 2:10; Eph 6:10-11**)

2. Still this alone is without value to God. The Ephesians learned this. (Rev 2:2-4)

II. The components of God's love (13:4-7)

- A. Love suffers long "an element of constraint to be patient or forbearing."
 - 1. Do you help others to grow or hate them for their weaknesses?
 - 2. How can love do this? You are not in the center of things. (Rom 15:1)
- B. Love is kind "gentleness".
 - 1. This a must in the work of God. (2 Tim 2:24-26)
 - 2. Love will show this kindness that builds others? Who do you go to for help?
- C. Love does not envy "of hostile emotion based on resentment (be moved with) envy, be filled with jealousy, be jealous of (Acts 17.5)."
- D. Love does not parade itself, is not puffed up "as speaking arrogantly boast, brag; behave as a braggart or windbag." Also as: "puff up, blow up; only fig. in the NT make proud or arrogant, cause to become haughty (1Cor 8.1); become conceited or proud (1Cor 4.6).

- E. Love does not behave rudely "as defying moral standards act disgracefully, behave improperly; as defying social standards be ill-mannered or rude (1Cor 13.5).
- F. Love does not seek its own "to strive for" and "to one's own interest or advantage."
 - 1. Here is the acid test to see if God's love is really in our lives?
 - 2. Can we do the work of the Lord with this attitude? (Phil 2:19-21)
- G. Love is not provoked (is not irritable or resentful RSV) "as keeping a mental record take into account, keep in mind, count (up)"
- H. Love thinks no evil "denoting a lack of something...bad, not as it ought to be"
- I. Love does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth "rejoice, be glad, be delighted" and as: "disregard for what is right; (1) as disregard for divine law, " and as: "of what has certainty and validity, of the real state of affairs, esp. as divinely disclosed truth"
 - 1. Are you glad when evil comes upon those who have hurt you.
 - 2. We must guard our hearts here. (Rom 1:32; 2 John 4)
- J. Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.
 - 1. God's love is all encompassing. (Gal 5:14)
 - 2. Is your life empty? What is in your heart?

III. God's Comparison of Love Verses Spiritual Gifts (13:8-13)

- A. Love will long outlast spiritual gifts (V8)
- B. Spiritual gifts were only a partial knowledge verses the full knowledge God is giving. (V9-10)
 - 1. When will that which is perfect come? (Jas 1:25)
 - 2. Spiritual gifts were only a temporary measure.
- C. True maturity would look to things that are really valuable. (V11-12)
- D. Even among things of great importance, Love will outlast them too. (V 13)

IV. Where does love come from?

- A. This love is learned. (Luke 7:40-43; 1 John 4:18,10)
 - 1. We choose to love. But How?
 - 3. God has chosen to identify Himself by this. (1 John 4:8) (Ex.
 - How many abilities does God have? What has He emphasized?)
- B. Do we give the emphasis that God does?
 - 1. Our relationship with God is identified by it. (1 John 4:8; John 17:23,26)
 - 2. Our relationship with both the world and other Christians are described by it. (John 13:34-35)
 - 3. Our growth and faithfulness is measured by it. (Eph 3:14, 17-19)

Conclusion: When God gives this kind of emphasis, we had better open our eyes.

- A. It is possible to have good knowledge and be fighting God. (1 Cor 8:1-3)
 - 1. Does the love of God describe your life?
 - 2. Be honest, are the fruits of God's love in your life?
- B. Why does love last over other things?
 - 1. Jesus knew it would, His kingdom is built upon it.
