Introduction: How do we become the people of God? Am I part of His people?

- A. God will always bring forth His people through a series of tests. (Zech 13:9)
 - 1. These people heard the same preaching but only some believed.

(Acts 13:48; 14:1-2; 28:24-29)

- 2. There were 12 spies but only 2 claimed the land could be taken. (Num 32:12)
- B. Some doubt that the Bible could be God's word because of the different reactions men have to it.
 - 1. God told us ahead of time that only a few would find the truth. (Mt 7:13-14)
 - 2. By design God has given a message that would cause the proud to reject it and the humble to find it. (1 Cor 1:22-29)
- C. Jesus plainly stated that God's truth must be carefully pursued.

(Jn 7:17; Mt 13:10-15)

- 1. Potentially anyone can find the truth of God, but those who do will have to dig deep and not be easily discouraged by the tests God places before them.
- 2. Do you have what it takes? Can you find the truth and keep the truth because you have a love for the truth?

I. The test of discovering who is Jesus of Nazareth?

- A. While God gave powerful evidence, there were many who did not believe in Jesus. (Mt 16:13-16)
 - 1. Jesus did not give men the kind of evidence they demanded but rather gave them sufficient evidence to believe. (Jn 5:38-40)
 - 2. When men demanded signs, Jesus gave them something else. (Jn 2:18-22)
 - 3. Consider the tests men had to pass in order to believe.
- B. The test of alleged contradictions
 - 1. How could Jesus be from Nazareth and still be the Messiah? (Jn 1:45-46; Mic 5:2)
 - 2. Did Jesus fulfill the prophecy? How would one come to know this?
 - 3. Those who are quick to turn away will never find God's truth!
- C. The test of knowledgeable, influential men. (Jn 7:45-49)
 - 1. These popular men did not believe that Jesus was the Messiah.
 - 2. How many stopped listening at the words of these men?
- D. The test of Jesus teaching and doing "hard" things.
 - 1. Jesus taught without apology in a way to drive off the shallow. (Jn 6:61-69)
 - 2. Jesus at times responded in a way that would have cased the sensitive to quit. (Mt 15:22-28)
 - 3. Blessed are those who persist and pass the test of truth.

II. The test of knowing how to be saved

- A. While God wants all men to be saved, one must search the scriptures to learn how to be saved. (1 Tim 2:3-4)
 - 1. Some are confused when they fail to find all requirements of salvation specifically listed in one verse.

- 2. There are very different views that are widely taught that require a careful serious study of God's word.
- B. As a result some will interpret a passage in a way to contradict others.
 - 1. Some interpret passages showing the necessity of faith in a way that contradicts passages teaching the necessity of baptism. (Jn 3:16; Acts 2:38)
 - 2. Others interpret salvation by grace in such a way to contradict other passages. (Eph 2:8-9; Jn 6:28-29)
- C. One must overcome the beliefs of influential men.

III. The test of our obedience

- A. Men who begin serving God will face additional tests of their faith.
 - 1. Abraham could plainly tell us that. (Heb 11:17-19)
 - 2. Abraham was tested and God proclaimed his grade! (Gen 22:12)

"I will welcome happiness, for it enlarges my heart; yet I will endure sadness, for it opens my soul. I will acknowledge rewards, for they are my due; yet I will welcome obstacles, for they are my challenge."

- B. Jesus expects His disciples to follow all things He commands. (Mt 28:20)
 - 1. He made no exceptions to those who were required to make a great sacrifice. (Mt 19:20-25)
 - 2. That is a requirement of all who would be His disciple. (Lk 14:33)
- C. We are tested in our morals. (Eph 5:3)
 - 1. We must stand against those who are in adulterous marriages. (Mt 19:9-10)
 - 2. As God's people we are to be separate! (Rev 18:4; 2 Cor 6:16-18)
- D. We are tested as a local church. (2 Cor 2:9)
 - 1. We must not let one or two outspoken men cause us to pull back from obeying.
 - 2. While conflict may come, we will be faithful to God.
 - 3. Do not be dismayed when such tests come! We can pass it. (Acts 15:1-2,22)

IV. The test of faithfulness in trials

A. God will allow various trials to come into our lives. (1 Pt 1:6-7; Rev 2:10) "On preacher noted that when God permits his children to go through the furnace, he keeps his eye on the clock and his hand on the thermostat."

- 1. This is a test that will bring greater blessings when we pass it. (Rom 5:3-5)
- 2. Do you glory in tribulations? (Phil 1:29-30)
- B. In these tests we must go back to the foundations of why we believe. (1 Pt 3:15)
 - 1. What did Jesus tell John the Baptist during his suffering? (Mt 11:3-6)
 - 2. We should not become offended at Christ because He allows certain things to come into our lives!

Conclusion: One day we will be God's people throughout eternity. (Rev 21:3-4)

A. The response you give will determine if you will become part of God's people.

(1 Pt 2:4-8)
