Introduction: The Christian has a very different view of life than the world.

- A. The Christian's greatest goal is to be pleasing to God. (**Heb 11:6**)
 - 1. This creates a very different set of priorities.
 - 2. What is failure to the world is success to the Christian. (2 Cor 6:4-10)
- B. The ultimate motivation of the Christian is to one day to be with God.
 - 1. Just like the reunion of long separated loved ones, we look to one day see the face of Jesus. (1 Pt 1:6-9)
 - 2. The challenge for the Christian is to keep this vision renewed in his heart. (1 Jn 3:1-3)

I. The Christian knows the certainty of the life after death

- A. How can I know things that I cannot see? (Heb 11:3, 27)
 - 1. This comes from a trust in God.
 - 2. Does this trust have any proof? Is faith and reason mutually exclusive?
- B. This is why Jesus came! (Heb 2:14-15)
 - 1. God became man! Why?
 - 2. One of Satan's major weapons was man's fear of death.
 - 3. Jesus was to replace fear with a clear picture of what death means.
- C. Jesus made his resurrection as the focal point to prove all that he claimed.
 - 1. This was the ultimate sign for all men. (Jn 2:18-22)
 - 2. Jesus and the prophets clearly predicted the manner of His death and the time of His resurrection.
 - 3. His enemies tried to use all the power at their disposal to prevent the resurrection.
 - 4. All of these things plus numerous eyewitnesses give abundant proof for any who want to know! (1 Cor 15:3-8)
 - D. These truths motivate the Christian to "go against the grain" in how they view this life. (2 Cor 5:14-17)
 - 1. What happens when we lose this vision?
 - 2. How many people have forgone advantages of this world because of their love of one day being with God? (Mt 19:9-12)

II. The Christian knows the certainty of the world to come

- A. We know what will happen at our physical death. (Lk 16:22-23)
 - 1. Those who are righteous are escorted by the angels of God to a place of paradise.
 - 2. Those who are unprepared likely have a terrifying death and a worse realization in the world to come.
- B. We know what will happen at our resurrection.
 - 1. We will be raised in a physical body like Jesus'. (2 Cor 4:13-14)
 - 2. That body will then be changed to a spiritual body. (1 Cor 15:50-55)
 - 3. There will also be an angel escort as we prepare to meet God.

(Mk 13:26-27)

- 4. The world as we have seen it will be destroyed. (2 Pt 3:10-11)
- C. We have a taste of what heaven will be like! (Rev 21:1-5)
 - 1. Can you imagine the blessings that the creator of this universe has for us? No, you cannot! (1 Cor 2:9; Eph 3:20-21)
 - 2. This is why the love of God is so powerful. We do not deserve any of this, but we serve a God who describes himself as the source of all love. (1 Jn 4:8-11)
- D. We will also experience a great reunion.
 - 1. We will continue to be who we are after our death.
 - 2. There was recognition of Moses and Elijah on the mount of transfiguration. (Mt 17:3-4)
 - 3. We do not go out of existence! We continue to live joyfully as a child of God.
 - 4. This makes death a blessed finish line to eternal fellowship with God.

III. The Powerful Death of a Christian

- A. We need to see others finish the race successfully. (2 Cor 4:16-18)
 - 1. The life of a sacrificing faith is needed to be seen by others.
 - 2. Consider the example of some recent funerals. The world can see the power of a living faith in those who live victoriously in suffering. (2 Cor 12:9-10)
 - 3. I have also seen others throw away their faith because of wanting this life to be easier. (Ex. Marriage, Divorce and remarriage)
- B. Do you hear voices in your head of those who have gone before?
 - 1. What a blessing for a child to see a parent die in faith!
 - 2. The example and the words of the righteous will help you. (Prov 1:8-10)
 - 3. What example are you setting?
- C. We live in a lost world that has given up on Christianity because most have never seen a living faith.
 - 1. Never underestimate how God can use you even though you appear weak and insignificant to the world.
 - 2. Your example may in time open the hearts of others. (1 Pt 2:11-12)
- D. Do I have this confidence in God?
 - 1. You will find yourself joyfully taking the more difficult path. (Mt 7:13-14)
 - 2. You will find yourself often thinking of the world to come. (1 Pt 1:13)

Conclusion: Be honest, are you hasting the day of the Lord?

- A. Will your death lead to hopeless end or an endless hope?
- B. We cannot know how to live until we know how to die.
