# The Longsuffering Of God

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*Introduction:* What is your God like?

- A. Some think of God as they would men.
  - 1. The story of an atheist in the 1800's who cried out in his lecture: "If there is a God, let Him strike me dead now!" After a moment he said: "See there is no God!"
  - 2. Someone replied in the newspaper the next day by telling a story of an ant that climbed upon a railroad track and proclaimed there is no train!
  - 3. We can be glad that God does not act like men!
- B. God's word makes it very clear that our God is longsuffering!
  - 1. God made this clear in the giving of the 10 commandments. (Ex. 34:4-7)
  - 2. Moses used this certain character of God in his prayer to Him. (Num 14:17-19)

## I. Who Needs the Longsuffering of God?

- A. What do we mean by "longsuffering"? (Rom 2:4)
  - 1. In Rom. 2:4 the Greek word is "makrothumia"
  - 2. Thayer's dictionary gives two definitions.
    - a) patience, endurance, constancy, steadfastness, perseverance.
    - b) patience, forbearance, longsuffering, slowness in avenging wrongs.
- B. All sinful men need the longsuffering of God!
  - 1. Men refuse to see the righteousness of God and thus minimize their own sins. (Rom 3:23-26)
  - 2. Every man on earth needs it, both the righteous and the unrighteous.
  - 3. In the scriptures, when a man appears before God he immediately becomes aware of his sin and <u>thus his need of longsuffering and</u> <u>forgiveness</u>. (Isa. 6:5-7)

### II. The Fruits of the Longsuffering of God

- A. It produces gratitude and humility. (1 Tim 1:15-16)
  - 1. Paul clearly understood the longsuffering of God. Are we any different?
  - 2. God wants our hearts. The revealing of His goodness changes ours!
  - 3. What if God gave us what we deserved immediately? (ex. Preacher who asked this question.)
  - 4. What if the Lord had returned in December of 2004? What if He came today? (2 Pt 3:9)
  - 5. Am I only deferring His anger of having it quenched?
- B. It produces hardness and arrogance. (Rom 2:3-4)
  - 1. Again some view God as they would a man....delay means weakness.

- 2. The sinner gains nothing by delaying God.
- 3. The real danger in each of us is becoming hardened to the grace of God.
- C. It produces change and growth in men. (1 Tim 1:12-16)
  - 1. We need to know what can be and to know that God will be with us.
  - 2. God knows how to build men.
- D. It produces confidence in the justice of God. (2 Cor 5:10)
  - 1. Was God's longsuffering good news or bad for Israel? (Isa 48:9)
  - 2. Is God's longsuffering good or bad news for us? (Rom 2:5)
- E. It makes us aware of the providence of God. (Rom 9:22-23)

### III. The Fruits of Our Own Longsuffering

- A. Longsuffering is a sign of real maturity.
  - 1. It is a fruit of the spirit. (Gal 5:22-23)
  - 2. It is a product of faith. (Col 1:11)
- B. Longsuffering is a choice....we put it on! (Col 3:8-14)
  - 1. This will eliminate the "short fuse" and hasty accusations. It will also eliminate gossip. It will eliminate revenge and cursing.
  - 2. Some mistake longsuffering for ignoring the person or even worse for harboring hate in silence!
- C. Longsuffering is essential for the growth of Christians and the church.
  - 1. How can true unity be possible? (Eph 4:1-2)
  - 2. The atmosphere of a church can be that of optimistic growth and encouragement or that of distrust, suspicion and revenge. Which will it be? (Ex. Those who try to guess why the preacher preaches a lesson.)
- D. Longsuffering must abound in those who teach! (2 Tim 4:1-2)
  - 1. Will I let God's word do its work?
  - 2. Many refuse to give the seed time to work. (Ex. Lima bean in jar.)
  - 3. We must make a judgment in those we are trying to restore. (Jude 22-23)
- E. Longsuffering in my life will have an influence on others.

### (2 Tim 3:10-12; Rom 12:17-21)

F. Longsuffering must be in our homes!

*Conclusion:* Longsuffering is essential for our salvation.

- A. That which is in the character of God must become a part of our lives!
  - 1. Please do not stop will the knowledge of a few facts!
  - 2. Let God's longsuffering work for your salvation. (2 Pet 3:14-15)
- B. Let God's longsuffering cause you to be urgent! (2 Cor 6:2)
