The Proof of Your Love (2 Cor 8)

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Introduction: It is important that we never lose the reason behind our work for the Lord.

- A. The Corinthians had demonstrated a willingness to ask questions and seek further understanding. For this Paul praised them. (1 Cor 11:2)
 - 1. Understanding is not easy! We must constantly seek it. (Jn 4:23-24)
 - 2. We fall into the way of the Pharisee's when we substitute the outward for the inward! (2 Cor 10:12)
- B. This chapter is dealing with a contribution he had earlier commanded the Corinthians. (1 Cor 16:1-4)
 - 1. In this contribution other churches were sending to the church at Jerusalem to help the needy Christians there.
 - 2. Paul knew that proper purpose and motivation was important throughout our efforts for the Lord.
 - 3. Also we see how Paul used wisdom in the handling of the money.

I. The Power of Example (8:1-7)

- A. When God's people understand the grace of God they will bear much fruit. (8:1)
 - 1. What did the grace of God bestow upon these churches? They made great sacrifices under extreme conditions.
 - 2. God's grace will push us to suffer for the glory of God. (Titus 2:11-12; Phil 1:29)
 - 3. How do you see the grace of God in your life?
- B. We can do much more than we realize!
 - 1. Consider the "impossible" conditions these brethren were experiencing. (8:2)
 - 2. Some of us might say to them: "You do not have to give!" We would be wrong.
 - 3. Are you a liberal? These brethren were poor yet rich! (2 Cor 6:10)
 - 4. These brethren begged Paul to let them give. Why? Because they wanted to have fellowship in the work of God. (8:4)
 - a. Would you tell someone that they did not have to pray?
 - b. Do we view our giving this way? (Phil 4:15-17)
 - 5. What is the key to abounding in any work we do? (8:5; 1 Cor 6:19-20)
 - a. Far too many have never died to the world! They still think they are their own master!
 - b. How have you planned your day tomorrow?
- C. We need to abound in our work to its completion! (8:6-7; 10-11)
 - 1. Why do many start and fail? (Lk 14:28-30, 33)
 - 2. When we are half hearted there is much damage done to us and to others by example. (Heb 6:11-12)
 - 3. Let us not be satisfied in just doing something, let us abound in it! Would Paul cite you as an example for others?

II. Maintaining Proper Motivation (8:8-15)

A. Paul had earlier commanded these Corinthians to give. (1 Cor 16:1-2)

- 1. The word "order" means: **6486** διατάσσω strictly arrange carefully, make precise arrangement; hence order, direct, command (MT 11.1); middle with the same sense (AC 24.23); passive be ordered or ordained (GA 3.19)
- 2. We know that the same command applies to us because of the obligation given to churches tat involves money! (2 Cor 11:8)
- 3. When we take everything that God says on this subject we apply this verse concerning how money is raised. This is a matter of authority. (2 Tim 3:16-17)
- B. Paul also makes an appeal on the basis of God's love in them. (8:8)
 - 1. Paul knew that those who have the love of God in them will respond to the work of God if they are commanded or not!
 - 2. This is a good test for us! Do we only do what is required? Do minimums become maximums?
 - 3. What did Jesus give for us? (8:9)
 - 4. Do you think this way? This is the key for motivation! "What would Jesus do?"
- B. Why did one church send money to another church? (8:12-15)
 - 1. Paul wanted them to know clearly that there was a need!
 - 2. The work of caring for needy members was the God given obligation of the local church.
 - 3. This assistance was temporary and later the tables could be turned.
 - 4. This bears no resemblance to the sponsoring church arrangement developed by brethren in the 50's.
 - 5. Do you know how this church spends its money.

III. Wisdom in Protecting Reputation (8:16-24)

- A. When dealing with money it is important to go to extra lengths to do things right.
 - 1. Paul used men of good reputation. (8:16-18, 22-23)
 - 2. Each church chose who they would send. This is an example of autonomy! (8:19; 1 Cor 16:3-4)
 - 3. Paul knew the potential of misrepresentation. (8:20-21)
- B. The Corinthians also had a reputation based upon this test! (8:19, 24) *Conclusion:* What if every member did as you?
