# A Living God --- Before the Foundation of the World www.aubeacon.com

**Introduction:** We need to understand the impact of the unseen upon the things that we see.

- A. The Bible tells us that the greater reality is found in the unseen. (Heb 11:1-3)
  - 1. Years ago a Christian professor met an expert in the origins of the universe and heard him lecture.
  - 2. Without a doubt this man in his brilliance gave several possibilities as to the origins of the universe.
  - 3. As the Christian heard the lecture he thought "this man really doesn't know and I do!" Why? We have heard from one who was there!
- B. The Bible has much to say about things that happened before the universe even existed!
  - 1. These things have great impact over everyday life for us.
  - 2. More importantly we can understand the temporary purpose of this universe and the eternal existence each of us will experience.
  - 3. We will learn much about the character of the God we serve in this study.

### I. Before the creation a triune God planned to act on our behalf

- A. There was a plan from a triune God that involved each person of the Godhead.
  - 1. God the Father was author of the plan. (Eph 1:3-4)
  - 2. Jesus was to be slain according to the plan.
  - 3. The Holy Spirit was to reveal the plan once for all. (Jn 14:23-26)
- B. The shows the incredible wisdom of God in a perfect plan.
  - 1. Satan and his forces had no chance. (1 Cor 2:7-8)
  - 2. This gives us great assurance that we have committed ourselves to a God who will never fail us. (Heb 12:28)
  - 3. We actually hold a central place in the plan of God! (Psa 8:3-4; 144:2-3)
  - 4. This is a plan we cannot in our right minds refuse. There will be no other way to be saved! (Jn 14:6)
- C. We should be both humbled and awed that God has acted and spoken.
  - 1. If you think Christians are too "radical" then look at who has spoken to them! (Heb 1:1-3)
  - 2. Do you realize that we have been given "the mind of Christ?" (1 Cor 2:16)

## II. The triune God was personally involved in the execution of this plan

- A. God planned to become man! (Jn 1:1, 14)
  - 1. This concept is mind boggling! How can this be?
  - 2. Jesus, the Son of God, willingly limited His powers and experienced His life as a man. Words cannot describe the sacrifice involved in this. (Phil 2:5-8)
  - 3. How could one endure such a change? We can understand why prayer was so dear to our Lord.
- B. He was exposed to prideful, sinful men and never once acted in self-interest and pride.

- 1. We would have wanted to jump up and down saying "Do you know who you are talking to!"
- 2. Imagine the infinite powers of God and then seeing men coming to Jesus and laughing at him and rejecting Him. (Jn 1:10-11)
- 3. God became man to be known as a suffering servant. (Isa 53:3-5)
- 4. He did this for his ear and his heart was dedicated to fulfilling a plan to save us. (Isa 50:5-7; Lk 9:51; Jn 11:16)
- C. Our Lord felt the full force of temptation and suffering. (Heb 5:7-9)
  - 1. Why suffer like this? He wanted to show us the way.
  - 2. Salvation is free but very costly. The costs were known from the foundation of the world. (1 Pt 1:20)
  - 3. A living faith is not an aimless wander or accommodating the religions of men.
  - 4. We cannot stop short of a complete commitment to this plan that puts us at odds with the world! (Heb 12:2-4)

## III. Jesus revealed a glory that awaits us by faith

- A. Ultimately we must learn that the unseen world is permanent and this world will not last. (1 Jn 2:17)
  - 1. Jesus wanted us to see Him reject the advantages of this world for a future, greater glory. (Jn 16:31-33)
  - 2. He wanted them to know that God the Father had prepared a place for them. (Jn 14:1-4)
- B. Jesus personally used this knowledge to complete His race on earth. (Jn 17:4-5)
  - 1. The knowledge of that glory gave Jesus great motivation to complete the terrible finish! This was "the joy that was set before Him." (Heb 12:2)
  - 2. That joy was much more than being a self-centered joy.
  - 3. What do you do when you see something of great glory? You want to share that with those you love.
  - 4. The God of the universe one day wants to show us something! THINK! (Jn 17:24)

### IV. What do we learn from the actions of a triune God?

- A. Subjection is the path of faith.
  - 1. We put ourselves completely under the direction of Christ. (Mt 28:18-20)
  - 2. We put ourselves under others. (1 Cor 11:3; Heb 13:17)
  - 3. Our culture hates these concepts, but the Lord's way was hated when He walked the earth
- B. Our God understands and is patient and longsuffering. (James 5:10-11)
  - 1. Our God will let us be tested and suffer.
  - 2. Here is where He molds us and draws us closer to Him. (James 1:2-5)
- C. Let us stir up our minds to see the unseen! (1 Pt 1:13-14)
  - 1. Have you noticed 2 things that often go together? One who has a strong confidence in the glory of God lives a life that often experiences suffering!
  - 2. "If the eye would have no tears then the soul would have no rainbow."
