Restoring Marriage to the Will of God

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Introduction: This will be the greatest test if the church is to continue strong.

- A. Our culture is a strong opponent! (1 Jn 5:3-5)
- B. It is not enough just to stay together in marriage. We must have the love of God be a reality in our homes. (Eph 5:25-27)

I. Restoring God's Law on Marriage, Divorce and Remarriage

- A. What has happened in our country? (Heb 13:4, Mt 19:9)
 - 1. Those who marry and stay married are a minority.
 - 2. This church will be a minority even among brethren if we stand as we ought!
 - 3. The peer pressure to live together before marriage is great.
- B. What Constitutes a marriage?
 - 1. We must carefully define words! Without such care a verse can be twisted.
 - 2. Marriage is a covenant between two eligible people of the opposite sex to enter into the relationship of marriage. (Mal 2:14)
 - a. We follow the laws of the government if they are not against the law of God. (Rom 13:1-2)
 - b. The government allows a preacher to conduct the ceremony!
 - c. Fornication or the sex act does not constitute a marriage. (Jn 4:16-19)
 - d. Can two marry themselves? NO.
- C. Who is eligible to marry?
 - 1. One who has never married. (1 Cor 7:2)
 - 2. One whose mate has died. (Rom 7:3)
 - 3. One who has put away their mate for fornication. (Matt 19:9)
- D. What Constitutes a Divorce?
 - 1. It is a legal breaking of the marriage relationship. (Matt 19:3-6)
 - a. One may break the relationship without breaking the marriage bond. (Rom 7:2; 1 Cor 7:10-11)
 - b. Some "single" people are in fact "bound" to another.
 - c. Herod had a marriage to one who was bound to another. (Mk 6:16-18)
 - 2. God only recognizes a divorce for one reason. (Matt 5:32)
 - 1. It takes true conviction to stay in a marriage that has turned bad when there is no cause for divorce.
 - 2. A mate who drives another into adultery is not innocent.
 - 3. There is no such thing as a "mental" divorce or a "mental" marriage!

II. Restoring a Heart of Unselfishness

- A. It is not easy to put another first in your decisions! (Eph 5:25-28)
 - 1. During my single years I found many activities that required only one person.
 - 2. While I was only one I did not have to wait on anyone, give explanations as to what I was doing, or wait on someone before leaving.
 - 3. However I do not want to go back to that life.
- B. When someone marries another they must now make decisions for two.

- 1. Marriage begins with a free will decision to live for two. What were the vows and promises you made at marriage?
- 2. God will hold us to our marriage vows. (Mal 2:14)
- 3. Many forget their vows and let selfishness take over.

C. How do two become one? (Matt 19:6)

- 1. This is not just a matter of physical needs, however it is a part.
- 2. This is not a matter of negotiation.
- 3. Two people become one by submitting to God's will. (Matt 19:3-6)
- 4. God is the only foundation for a good marriage. Why? A servant of God must have learned to submit his spirit to God. (Luke 9:23-24; Jas 4:6-7)
- 3. When a man has this spirit he will eliminate selfishness, pride and the desire to fight to protect his "rights". (Jas 3:14-17)

III. Restoring Responsibility in Marriage

- A. The Blessings of God always carry a responsibility with them.
 - 1. This is true of salvation. The free gift of salvation produces a giving person!
 - 2. When one becomes a receiver only, in time the blessing will be lost.
 - 3. Remember we are talking about true service to God from the heart. It is possible to attend services while being like the devil at home. (Mal 2:13-17)
- B. Consider these responsibilities in marriage.

1. Trust (Prov 31:11)

- a. Honesty is something that we must fight to become part of our character.
- b. How many additional hurts come when you cannot trust your mate!
- d. What will you get when you marry a dishonest person?

2. Honor and Respect (Prov 31:28-31)

- a. Respect is a strong need of the man. (Eph 5:33)
- b. How does one gain respect? Let your honor be built upon service to the Lord. (Prov 3:13-16)
- c. A self-centered person will have no honor. Our children will see us!

3. Companionship (Ecc 4:10-12)

- a. This is based upon a common interest and a common serving one another!
- b. This does not come from physical desires alone. (Prov 2:16-17)
- c. What if you seek companionship with one who does not serve God?

4. The fulfillment of our sexual needs. (Heb 13:5; 1 Cor 7:3-5)

- a. A marriage that has become a "house-keeping" relationship is asking for trouble.
- b. Often problems in respect and communication will cause problems here.

5. A Life full of purpose and meaning. (Prov 31:10, 25)

- a. An abundant life does not happen by accident. (Jn 10:10)
- b. Will you change you attitude about your responsibilities?

Conclusion: God has richly provided wisdom for this life. (Jas 1:5)

- A. Our greatest need is a humble spirit so that we may learn and be blessed!
- B. God will never forsake those who serve Him, they will be blessed.
