Introduction: Have you ever had events that drained your motivation and caused you to ponder and do nothing?

- A. Two men, Cleopas and an unnamed man were in such a situation. (Luke 24:13-24)
 - 1. Events had shaken their confidence to the point where the redemption of Israel was considered a past failed event!
 - 2. They had come to believe that Jesus was a prophet, but not the Son of God.
- B. In these circumstances they proved to be blind to many things.
 - 1. While they heard of the evidence of His resurrection, they had not yet believed.
 - 2. They never understood the prophecies of a suffering and rejected Messiah! (Isa 52:13-15)

#20 GB - Exalted - 1, 2, 3

I. Hindrances to seeing the Risen Lord

- A. By failing to see the true spiritual work of His kingdom.
 - 1. They likely thought the redemption of Israel was going to be in a physical way. (Luke 24:21; Mt 20:21-22; Acts 1:6-8)
 - 2. Many become disappointed in the Lord over things He has never promised.

#64 GB - For You Have Promised - 1, 3, 4

B. By allowing disappointments in men to cloud our sight.

- 1. Jesus prepared His disciples that men would seek after their hurt. (John 16:1-3)
- 2. The greatest hurts will come from other Christians.
- 3. Paul knew there were those who were not true brothers. (2 Cor 11:26; Gal 2:4)
- 4. Keep you eyes on the Lord! (Rom 3:3-4)

#53 GB - The Rock of My Heart - 1, 2, 3

C. By allowing the tests of our faith to cloud our sight.

- 1. How many have said: "If God really loved me ...". Be careful!
- 2. We are told that our faith will be tested. (Jas 1:3; 1 Pt 1:7)
- 3. How many have given in to sin rather than wait on God's way. (Heb 10:35-39)

#147 GB – Be Strong and Courageous - 1, 2, 3

II. The fire of God's truth can purify our hearts.

- A. These men had reached the point where they could not see. (Lk 24:21-33)
 - 1. They had become so entrenched in their erroneous thinking that they could not see the truth. How did Jesus get them to see?
 - 2. He did not appeal to their "self-esteem" or appeal to their emotions. These things are not a foundation but often are a hindrance.

#126 BB – Open My Eyes, That I May See – 1, 2

- B. Jesus instilled faith in these men by appealing to the scriptures!
 - 1. Rather than being a calamity, His death was a victory. (Lk 24:25-27)
 - 2. This was no shallow study of a verse or two but: "beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures".
 - 3. Where is your faith? Is it built upon this foundation?
 - 4. Some passages He could have used. (Isa 7:14; Mic 5:2; Isa 53; Psa 22)

#112 BB – Teach Me Thy Way - 1, 3, 4

- C. Many are afraid to build their lives on such a foundation. (Matt 7:24-27)
 - 1. Many do not trust God. They are what they are from tradition and not conviction. (**Heb 11:6**)
 - 2. Others are afraid to study because they would find they are in error and the scriptures would demand change. (Jn 3:19-21)
 - 3. Still others open the scriptures but not their hearts.

#296 BB - How Firm a Foundation - 1, 2, 3

III. The fire of God's Truth will move us into action.

- A. Jesus brought this flame into their hearts. (Lk 24:32)
 - 1. They were going home to eat a late supper, tired and dejected. But as Jesus spoke the flame began to be kindled. They now see the truth: "He is risen!"
 - 2. They are energized and hurry back to Jerusalem ready to work.

#174 BB - Christ Arose - 1, 2, 4

- B. One of the great problems we face in the church is the number of good people who have a weak faith.
 - 1. You need not just to have faith, but a strong faith. A weak faith can blind you.
 - 2. Would you ask the Lord to increase your faith? (Lk 17:4-6)
 - 3. Why not start by filling your heart with the death, burial and resurrection of Jesus?

#167 BB - We Saw Thee Not - 2, 3

- C. A living faith will fill your heart and make you active.
 - 1. The early disciples were zealous and caused changes wherever they went. (Acts 17:6; Acts 8:3-4)
 - 2. Let each of us make faith our own! Let us face our doubts and gain strength from God!

Conclusion: Can you see the risen Lord? Is He in your life?

- A. He must be invited in. (Rev 3:20-22)
- B. The issue is not "knowing a lot" but "who you know".
