Five Things to Teach Your Children

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Introduction: Our God gives us great guidance concerning things that really matter.

- A. It should be a natural concern for parents to give their children the best upbringing.
 - 1. Societies have vastly different views on this. Some have discarded the home. (Rom 1:30-31 KJV; Deut 18:9-10; 2 Kgs 16:2-3)
 - 2. A young man was working a puzzle. A boy was on one side and the country was on the other. "If I get the boy put together right, the country will be ok!"
- B. A group of historians spoke recently on CSPAN. All expressed shock at the rapidly changing morals in the country. (Prov 14:34; Gen 15:16)
 - 1. The church began during a time of great wickedness in Roman culture.
 - 2. Even amidst persecution and social ridicule Christians were able to instill faith in their children and see a rapid growth of the church.
 - 3. Consider some basic truths each generation must teach in the home.

I. Respect for authority

- A. You cannot have a relationship with God without respect. (**Deut 6:24-25; 7:9-11**)
 - 1. With this basic truth as a foundation a man who fears God will also show respect in many different human relationships.
 - 2. Many are teaching a very different "god than revealed in the Bible. Many believe in a "god" that has spoken on almost nothing! (2 Cor 11:3-4)
- B. Respect for governmental authority. (Rom 13:1-2; 1 Pt 2:13-14)
 - 1. Should we only respect a government we agree with?
 - 2. What was the response of the early church to governmental persecution?
 - 3. We must respect, obey and pray for all of those in authority over us. We must disobey our government when it goes against God's law. (Acts 5:28-29)
 - 4. Where does this respect begin? In the home, at school, dealing with police officers and at work!
- 5. Parents your real attitude will be revealed and transmitted to your children! C. Respect for brothers and sisters in Christ.
 - 1. The Lord commands us to have a certain attitude towards all Christians! (1 Pt 1:22; Rom 14:10, 15, 19)
 - 2. You should respond decisively to any disrespect towards Bible class teachers.
 - 3. Those who lead should be given respect. (Heb 13:17; 1 Thess 5:12-13)
 - 4. A young girl tried to "teach" her boyfriend by complaining about Christians.
 - 5. Respect cannot be learned when bitterness is planted in the heart. This is why some lose their young. (**Deut 29:18-19**)
 - 6. Parents can follow their children in departing from the Lord and His people.

II. How to worship God

A. It is difficult for a child to seek and meditate on God when he lives in a videogame world. (**Heb 11:6**)

- 1. As parents you can give your children the faith that you possess. (2 Tim 1:5)
- 2. You can read to them, talk to them, let them see you worship God.
- 3. Your children will be serious about that which you are serious about. (Prov 22:6)
- B. Worship must be learned by each individual. How can we teach this?
 - 1. We should read and talk to them about scripture that is meaningful to us. (Ex. Bedtime stories, the loss of a grandparent, what to do when hurt by another.) (**Deut 6:5-7**)
 - 2. It is a great blessing when your child begins to turn to scripture and pray because he needs it and has learned to do so.
- C. Public worship is a time for learning.
 - 1. From the youngest of age there are things where we can involve our children.
 - 2. Putting an emphasis on being at every service teaches has an enormous impact.

III. How to work with others

- A. There are basic things necessary to establishing any relationship.
 - 1. Putting others ahead of self.
 - 2. Honesty.
 - 3. Learning how to listen.
 - 4. Compassion.
- B. The kind of relationships they form will determine their future.
- C. How to give anger over unjust treatment to God. (Mt 5:44-48)
 - 1. The next generation will be under greater pressure in these areas.
 - 2. If our children let bitterness rule their hearts all will be lost. (Eph 4:26-27)

IV. How to make faith your own

- A. How can a young person stand in an ungodly society? Consider Daniel. (Dan 1:8)
 - 1. Many laugh at applications concerning "external" things.
 - 2. Men of faith know that discernment must be taught and will bring great blessings! (Heb 4:12; 5:14)
 - 3. The discerning young person will pay a heavy price in the social circles of the world. (1 Pt 4:3-4, 12-14)
- B. Respect for God's word will lead to a careful discernment in all things. (Col 3:17)
 - 1. Does your child know the difference in the Lord's church and the ways of man?
 - 2. Churches that fail to discern in "doctrine" will also fail in morals.

V. How to build a home

- A. All of the previous points are part of the kind of heart needed in the home. (Eph 5:23-25, 33)
 - 1. Respect for God's plan limits who you can marry. (Mt 19:9)
 - 2. Marry one who will help you go to heaven.
- B. Many of you will see the fruits of your work for generations. Let us pray for God's help! (Prov 10:1; 17:21, 25; 23:24-25)
