## How Do You Pray? (Part 1)

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**Introduction:** Prayer is often a neglected area of the Christian's life.

- A. Paul commonly expressed the concern that Christians obtain the full extent of the blessings God has for them. (Eph 1:18-20)
  - 1. Prayer is the door which God expects us to regularly walk through. (James 4:2-3)
  - 2. Prayer as with anything that relates to God has rules! There is a right way and a wrong way to pray.
  - 3. Above all we must have a faithful heart. (James 1:6-8)
- B. In this series we will examine the components of prayer: **Praise, Confession, Petition and Intercession.** 
  - 1. By a careful study of these elements we can see how our prayers could be more effective!
  - 2. The Apostles after observing Jesus pray realized they needed more teaching! (Luke 11:1)
  - 3. A question for your consideration: "How do you pray?" Take these four components and consider where the bulk of your prayers stand.
  - 4. Most Christian's prayers center in petition.

### I. The Value of Praise and Thanksgiving

- A. Praise is good for us. (Psa 33:1-2)
  - 1. Praise is not an elaborate process. How many times have you seen the creation and expressed thanks. (Psa 8:3-4, 9; 9:1)
  - 2. One of the necessities of thankfulness is that selfishness must be eliminated. You must be looking at something other than yourself.
- B. To what extent should we be thankful? (1 Thess 5:18)
  - 1. Notice that it is not "for" everything, but "in" everything.
  - 2. Ex. One man who had a miserable day prayed: "O Lord, we thank you that every day is not like this one."

#### Homemaker's Prayer

Lord, we thank you for this sink of dirty dishes, for we have good food to eat. Thank you for this pile of dirty laundry, for we have nice clothes to wear.

I would like to thank you for all these unmade beds, for they were all comfortable last night. My thanks for this bathroom, complete with soggy towels, splattered mirror and grimy laboratory, it is still very convenient.

Thank you for this finger smudged refrigerator that needs defrosting so badly, for it has served us faithfully and inside are cool drinks and enough leftovers for another meal.

Thank you for this oven which absolutely must be cleaned today, for it has baked us many good things over the years.

Our whole family is thankful for the tall grass we are mowing, for we are grateful for our private vard.

Thanks for the slamming door, for the children are healthy and able to run and play.

Lord, the presence of all these chores awaiting me is witness that you have richly blessed this family.

I shall do them all gratefully and cheerfully.

- C. Ignoring thanksgiving is the first step to a corrupt heart. (Rom 1:20-21)
  - 1. A thankless heart will always become alienated from God. (Eph 4:17)
  - 2. On the other hand remember the song: "Count your many blessings .... and it will surprise you what the Lord has done".
- D. Praise will cause you to know God better. (Rom 8:29)
  - 1. Praise is on a higher level than thanksgiving in that we are out of the picture. Only God is in view!
  - 2. This will bring you to God's presence like never before. What can you praise God for?
  - 3. In prayer it is important to focus and not to drift!
  - 4. Do you "know your God?" (Jer 8:7, 19; 17:5-8)

### II. Bible Examples of Praise and Thanksgiving in Prayer

- A. I ask you to consider using these prayers as a model.
  - 1. Take notes of these prayers and learn to pray like these godly men.
  - 2. As with any prayer, make it a true expression of your heart based upon what God has done for you.
- B. The prayer of David after deliverance from his enemies. (2 Sam 22:2-4)
  - 1. It is good to begin your prayers with this focus upon God alone.
  - 2. Again, this will do you much good.
- C. The great prayer of confession led by the Levites in the days of Nehemiah. (Neh 9:5-6)
- D. A great Psalm of David. (Psa 103:1-2, 19-22)
  - 1. Knowledge of the character of God encourages us to pray!
  - 2. What do you need to know about God that will cause you to confess your sin?
- E. Those in the presence of God. (Rev 4:11; 5:9-10, 12-24)
  - 1. Remember, God does not need our praise. It is good for us!
  - 2. Do you want to go to heaven? What will you be doing there?

# III. Challenges to a Thankful Heart

- A. Selfishness. (Jas 4:1-3)
- B. Bitterness. (1 Peter 3:7; Job 2:9-10)
- C. Ignorance. (Gal 4:8-9; 1 Peter 2:1-3)
- D. Indifference. (Heb 11:6)

*Conclusion:* How do you pray? Are you thankful? Do you express that to God? (Phil 4:6-7)
