The Resurrection of Christ and Moral Truth <u>www.aubeacon.com</u>

Introduction: The path of the Christian is very different than that of the world.

- A. Jesus often spoke of a word that the world scoffs at --- truth! (Jn 8:32)
 - 1. Faith in Jesus always comes from a mind that has learned to distinguish between truth and error.
 - 2. Having a mind that is willing to reason and test things is the first step to coming to know God. (Lk 8:15)
- B. Many people talk about the historical Jesus and may even acknowledge His resurrection but have no faith in the Son of God.
 - 1. Can one have a faith in God without having a reason to believe?
 - 2. Because we can know who Jesus is then we can know how to live! (1 Jn 1:1-6)

I. How can we find the truth?

- A. Pilate honestly reflected the vain wisdom of this world when he asked: "What is truth?" (Jn 18:37-38)
 - 1. Pilate had come to believe there was no such thing as "truth."
 - 2. He simply came to make his own reality to fit his needs. Jesus was a problem that needed to be solved. Truth would require too high of a price!
 - 3. That kind of a mindset has terrible consequences. Needless to say that Pilate washing his hands will not help him one bit at the judgment.
- B. When you eliminate God there is no basis for truth.
 - 1. What is morality? Philosophers can "successfully" prove that Adolph Hitler was just as "moral" of a man as Abraham Lincoln.
 - 2. God expects rulers to make moral laws and execute them. (Rom 13:3-4)
 - 3. When a country divorces itself from God then there will be no moral basis for their laws. What are the standards of the world?
 - 4. There are three basic "standards" of the morality of the world. (Note: when any of these are the goal you can lie, cheat, etc.. as long as you meet the goal!)
 - a. What will work? (Utilitarian practicality)
 - b. What do most people accept? (Majority rule)
 - c. Who has the strength to impose their will on everyone else? (Power Politics)

II. Why are we motivated to live a different life than the world?

- A. Because we first come to believe there is a God.
 - We can know there is a God simply from the design of the creation. (Rom 1:20)
 - 2. We can know that God has acted and spoken to us by the resurrection of Jesus Christ. (Acts 2:32, 36)
 - 3. When we come to know that Jesus is the Son of God then we can know the nature of the one true God and his will for our lives. (Jn 8:31-32)

- 4. We learn that we have a God who loves us and has acted on our behalf. He wants to redeem us and remake us. (Jn 3:3-5; 10:10)
- B. When we come to trust in Jesus then we submit to Him as our Lord. We live a life of repentance. (Rom 6:17-23)
 - 1. The Christian life is one where we discern good and evil and stand!
 - 2. The reason that more do not become Christians is because they do not want to change their lives! (Jn 3:16-20)
 - 3. This will bring a strong reaction from the world. This will be the basis for persecution.
- C. True Christianity will always be concerned with moral standards.
 - 1. Did Paul just talk to Felix about salvation and not address "lifestyles"? (Acts 24:24-26)
 - 2. Is it "unloving" to speak to unbelievers about these things? We make a serious mistake when we think it is unspiritual to speak up about moral issues. What are men saved from? (Rom 1:16-17; 3:23)
- D. There will be a judgment day. (Jn 12:48; Mt 12:36-37; Lk 10:13-16)
 - 1. A day of personal accountability before God should be an absolutely terrifying prospect for all men.
 - 2. The proof of the judgment day is the same proof of Jesus as the Son of God, the resurrection of Christ. (Acts 17:30-31)

III. Standing for the truth always involves a cost

- A. The truth is unpopular because many are unwilling to pay the price. Sadly, they pay an infinitely higher price later. (Rom 14:12)
 - 1. Here is where a faith in God can be such a blessing. When we know that this life is not all there is then we can have joy in suffering. (1 Pt 1:3-7)
 - 2. It is encouraging when we have companions in suffering. (Heb 10:32-34)
 - 3. Any Christian with a living faith will stand. But it is possible to cast such a faith away. (Heb 10:35)
- B. We must always be a people who unashamedly know the truth, live the truth and speak up and stand for the truth. (3 Jn 1-4)
 - 1. We need more than ever to stand up and be counted.
 - 2. There will be some in the church that will be ashamed of your stand.
- Conclusion: Our Lord will never be ashamed of those who stand for Him!
