# Developing Good relationships Among Brethren www.aubeacon.com

*Introduction:* The content of our heart is revealed in how we treat other people.

- A. If a person helps others throughout their lives they are likely motivated by God!
  - 1. Jesus emphasized the connection between our work with others and the final judgment! (Mt 25:34-36)
  - 2. This heart must be among Christians in their relationship with each other. (1 Cor 12:23-27)
- B. We will reflect in our attitude towards our brothers in Christ if we are learning the wisdom of God or the wisdom of the world. (Jas 3:14-18)
  - 1. The wisdom of the world is easy to learn!
  - 2. To find the wisdom of God we must pursue it every day.
  - 3. We have a tendency to quickly forget God's truths under difficult times. Our relationships with our brethren fall into this category.

#### I. Develop a greater love for God

- A. How will I know if I am in fellowship with God? (1 Jn 4:13)
  - 1. Why not take the test to know "that we abide in Him, and He in us?"
  - 2. The love of God must become a part of me to the extent that it is shown towards my brethren! (1 Jn 4:8-12)
  - 3. Are you in fellowship with God?
- B. Do I really love God or am I a liar? (1 Jn 4:19-21)
  - 1. It is easy to talk but what is really in my heart?
  - 2. God's proposition is simple: "If one man loves God and another man loves God, then these two men will love each other!"
  - 3. A failure to have the proper attitude towards my brother is a failure of my love for God.
- C. Are you begotten of God? (1 Jn 5:1-2)
  - 1. John showed the hypocrisy of the Gnostics who, while claiming great Knowledge they despised those outside their elitist sect.
  - 2. What will everyone who is begotten of God do?

## II. Develop a positive attitude towards others

- A. It is easy to become negative towards other people.
  - 1. Elisha gave up on Israel when God knew better! (1 Kgs 19:14, 18)
  - 2. I have not known anyone very long that did not disappoint me in some way.
  - 3. If you are not careful you will have a negative attitude towards that person where you magnify and imagine faults while becoming blinded to the good.
- B. With a negative attitude we will become partial with our brethren. (Jas 2:1-4,9)
  - 1. Two men may have the same fault but we are positive towards one and negative towards the other. This ought not to be!
  - 2. Which wisdom puts away this partiality? (Jas 3:17)

- C. A positive attitude does not overlook faults but it does seek the best for everyone.
  - 1. What does the love of God do for us? (1 Cor 13:4-8)
  - 2. How did Jesus deal with the faults of His apostles?

### III. Develop a "togetherness" spirit.

- A. What kind of things should Christians be doing together?
  - 1. Why was the early church effective in reaching the lost? (Acts 2:44-47)
  - 2. After persecution they prayed together. (Acts 4:23-24)
  - 3. In famine they shared and gave together. (Acts 4:31-35)
  - 4. At the burial of Stephen they mourned together. (Acts 8:2)
  - 5. This church did not forget these occasions! This is how closeness develops among God's people. (Ex. Tragedies we have shared)
- B. Do you take advantage of opportunities to be with other Christians?
  - 1. Have you gathered with other Christians to pray? (Acts 12:5)
  - 2. How is it possible that we weep together without being together at some time? (Rom 12:15)
- C. We must have the attitude of "we" and not "they." (Col 2:1-2)
  - 1. We must reach out to others within this congregation!
  - 2. Let's not be a complainer who talks about what "they" are doing!
  - 3. Every person makes a contribution to this work. If you are not involved please step out of the fringes and get into the middle of things.
- D. Three things we must do.
  - 1. Push aside our timidity and take risks for God.
  - 2. Cast aside our selfishness and look to the needs of others.
  - 3. Put away the negative attitudes in our own heart. (Jn 13:34-35)

## IV. Develop a forgiving spirit.

- A. Consider the example of the prodigal son.
  - 1. He returned home with a deep sense of unworthiness and found the love and forgiveness of his father. (Lk 15:21-24)
  - 2. A bad relationship still existed between his older brother. Why was this? (Lk 15:25-32)
- B. Two important steps to forgiveness.
  - 1. We must always have a sense of unworthiness. (Lk 15:29; 1 Tim 1:15)
    - a. When we think to much of ourselves we will not forgive.
    - b. Have you recognized your own sins? This will bring more tolerance.
  - 2. We must have a forgiving spirit.
    - a. We must forgive all who seek it.
    - b. Our goal is to restore, not to get even. (Gal 6:1)
