# What is God's Will on Marriage, Divorce and Remarriage? www.aubeacon.com

#### *Introduction:* Do we have the faith to obey God?

- A. We face tremendous pressure to do right when the culture turns against us.
  - 1. The Christians at Ephesus learned this lesson! (Acts 19:23-28, 35-36)
  - 2. Consider the major shift in this country on homosexuality.
  - 3. The Bible teaching of marriage and divorce is also despised.
- B. We need to display the faith of Abraham and stand by faith regardless of the consequences! (Heb 11:8-9, 17-18)
  - 1. The direction a church takes depends of its leadership and the teaching that is given on a consistent basis!
  - 2. I want my family and all that I know to go to heaven. There is only one kind of faith that will lead there! (Rom 4:16)

### I. What does God say about marriage?

- A. Our study will focus on the teaching under the New Covenant. (Col 2:14-17)
- B. Marriage is a covenant between two people of the opposite sex to enter into the relationship of marriage. (Mal 2:14)
  - 1. The Christian will also follow the laws of the government that does not conflict with the laws of God. (Rom 13:1-4)
  - 2. Why does a preacher can conduct a "marriage ceremony"?
  - 3. Fornication or the sex act does not constitute a marriage. (John 4:16-19)
  - 4. Can two marry themselves? NO.
- C. Who is eligible to marry?
  - 1. One who has never married. (1 Cor 7:2)
  - 2. One whose mate has died. (Rom 7:3)
  - 3. One who has put away their mate for fornication. (Matt 19:9)

## II. What does God say about divorce?

- A. God hates divorce. (Mal 2:16)
  - 1. How does one who loves God take this lightly?
  - 2. This word should never be used lightly as a threat.
- B. Divorce is a legal breaking of the marriage relationship. (Matt 19:3-6)
  - 1. One may break the relationship without breaking the marriage bond. (Rom 7:2; 1 Cor 7:10-11)
  - 2. Some "single" people are in fact "bound" to another.
  - 3. Herod had a marriage to one who was bound to another. (Mark 6:17)
- C. God only recognizes a divorce for one reason. (Matt 5:32)
  - 1. It takes true conviction to stay in a marriage that has turned bad when there is no cause for divorce.
  - 2. A mate who drives another into adultery is not innocent.
- D. There is no such thing as a "mental" divorce or a "mental" marriage!

- 1. This doctrine has allowed some to block reconciliation. "I am already divorced!"
- 2. Some take this position because of a desire to justify relatives.

#### III. What does God say about divorce and remarriage?

- A. When one has put away their mate for fornication, they have a scriptural right. (Matt 19:9-12)
  - 1. Some must be reconciled or stay single. (1 Cor 7:10-11)
  - 2. There are some who are single for the "kingdom of heaven."
- B. If one is not eligible for marriage, they should not date!
  - 1. Some Christians "fall in love" first, and then investigate.
  - 2. You should know if the one you wish to date is eligible for marriage.
- C. Some Christians seek to reconcile with the guilty mate.
  - 1. Once this is done then the "slate is clean" thus the unfaithfulness would not be a cause for a future divorce.
  - 2. One may put away their mate for adultery and forgive them at the same time! (Matt 19:9; Rom 12:17-21)
  - 3. Even when one is innocent, there are difficult consequences to a divorce.

## IV. Positions that fail to recognize that God has spoken.

- A. Discovery of adultery after the divorce. (Mt 19:9)
  - 1. If one divorced without any cause of adultery then it is sin. (Mt 5:32)
  - 2. After the "relief" of the divorce, it is easy to re-create the past.
- B. Mental Divorces and Mental Marriages
  - 1. Some believe they can divorce and then wait for the other to remarry. They then "put them away in their mind."
  - 2. This is not a divorce! The divorce has already occurred. There is only one option here. (1 Cor 7:10-11)
- C. When one is loosed, both are loosed. (Matt 19:9; 1 Cor 7:10-11)
- D. When an unbeliever "leaves" their Christian mate, the Christian may remarry. (1 Cor 7:10-15)
  - 1. The "bondage" here is one in which the Christian was never under.
  - 2. Does "except" still mean "except"? (Matt 19:9; 5:32)
  - 3. This position is sometimes stated as: "The unbeliever is not amenable to the law of God." If so then there are no marriages in the world!
  - 4. Baptism does not wash away unlawful marriages. (Mk 6:17-18)
- E. These positions have one thing in common, ALL MARRIAGES ARE OK!
