Introduction: How does God view this church?

- A. While it is true that God views us as individuals and will judge us as such, He also sits in judgment of churches.
 - 1. Individuals must be first concerned with God's view of them.

(2 Cor 10:18; Rom 14:11-12)

- 2. The Lord knows what is going on in churches. They can be rejected by Him. (Rev 1:11-13, 20; 2:5)
- B. Do we see a church as God does?
 - 1. It depends upon our spirituality. (2 Tim 1:13)
 - 2. How does God provide for a healthy (sound) church? (2 Tim 4:3)

Sound - ὑγιαίνω be healthy or *sound*; literally, of physical and mental soundness be healthy, be well (LU 7.10); figuratively, of doctrinal teaching be correct, be accurate, be sound (1T 1.10)

I. A Healthy Church is Characterized by a Determination to Please God.

- A. We call ourselves a church of Christ, but are we? (Gal 1:10; 1 Thess 2:4)
 - 1. Where are our hearts? What do we expect from our work together?
 - 2. Many churches have made men the center of their efforts.
 - 3. When men guit over what men do they leave out the Lord.
- B. Consider what men thought verses what God thought concerning the churches of Asia.

	<u>Men</u>		God
1. Sardis -	"It lives!"		"It is dead" (Rev 3:1)
2. Laodicea	- "Everything's grea	.t!"	"It is miserable." (Rev 3:17)
3. Smyrna -	"They are poor"		"They are rich" (Rev 2:8)

C. Have you ever considered what God thinks of the University church?

II. A Healthy Church is Characterized by a Concern for the Lost.

- A. This is worded carefully. Notice what is not said.
 - 1. A great personal work program with many baptisms.
 - 2. A great building with a showy service.
 - 3. A watered down gospel that attracts big crowds.
- B. Our efforts must be based on a real deep concern for souls.
 - 1. With that concern every person must be doing something.
 - 2. Too often we want the appearance of activity. In this case we are just playing at it.
 - 3. One who is concerned will prepare so that he will be able to teach.

(2 Tim 2:24-26)

- 4. Do we plan our work? That is find a prospect, work to study with them and bring them to a decision?
- 5. There are several doing this. We need more workers!
- C. Consider the efforts of the early church.
 - 1. These were concerned people. It involved everyone! (Acts 8:3-4)
 - 2. Notice the involvement of every member. (Acts 11:19-23)
 - 3. Ex. Henry Fickling "Is that the man? --- If he has a soul, he is!"
 - 3. Again all of the church was concerned. Where do you stand? (Acts 13:1-2)

III. A Healthy Church is Characterized by a Strong Stand for the Truth

- A. Standing for the truth involves preaching the truth, fighting error, calling people out of error into a stand for the truth, and paying a high price in the process.
 - 1. Paul fought the Judaizing teachers. (Gal 2:4-5, 14)
 - 2. John fought the Gnostics. (1 John 4:1; 2 John 9)
 - 3. Those who fellowship error will reach no one, they have joined the other side.
- B. This stand will be done in God's way. (2 Cor 10:3-5)
 - 1. Our goal will be to teach men God's word.
 - 2. Force, deception or pressure is not God's way. Let us teach!
- C. Be ready, there will be strong reactions.
 - 1. On the one hand there will be those who view us favorably.

(Acts 2:47; 5:13, 26)

- a. Our stand for truth will be appreciated by some!
- b. We will never see all the good by the stand of a few!
- 2. Our enemies will hate and misrepresent us. (1 Peter 4:14)
- 3. God will be with us! (Matt 28:20)
- D. We must let people know where we stand.
 - 1. We will call men out of denominationalism and liberalism. We will call them out of the world.
 - 2. Never forget that many are aware of what is going on here. Above all, God is aware. (Heb 4:13)
 - 3. Please do not be ashamed of God's truth. (2 Tim 1:8, 12)

Conclusion: Are we a church that pleases God?

- A. It starts with each of us. What do we want to achieve?
- B. God will provide for us when we seek to do His will.
